THE CSW STORY

For over a decade, Constituent Services Worldwide (CSW) has quietly reshaped the lives of D.C.'s most vulnerable residents through a homegrown model of education, experience, employment, and entrepreneurship (E4: Lifecycle). CSW was established in 2011 to continue Marion Barry Summer Youth Employment Programs created by Ward 7 Advisory Neighborhood Commissioner, Dr. Robert Jordan, after a two-term administration. CSW started with a Fairfax Village 800 sg. ft condo and a vision-to expand on the legacy of the Marion Barry and reach residents who've long been left behind. Over the course of 14 years, CSW has grown into a Capitol Hill 6,500 square foot operation that supports our Department of Labor Workforce Innovation Act (WIOA), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Mayor's Office of Returning Citizens (MORCA), Department of Energy and Environment of Human Services (DHS) Temporary Assistance for Needy Family (TANF) programs, and over 35 small and local business entrepreneurs.

The E4 Lifecycle solution efficiently allocates

nationwide government program funds to maximize social benefits while converting government benefit recipients to contributors to the local economy tax base or higher education. Multiple investments into social services experiments subsidized by CSW has produced a formula for achieving an 87% certification rate an average investment under \$5,000 per participant. The program delivers a 2x return on investment for government and tax payers with measurable returns: reducing dependency on public assistance and turning residents into wage earners, taxpayers, college students, and even business

THE FIGHT

CSW entered 2025 with a \$5 million dollar budget and has been a \$4 million dollar company for the past two calendar years (2023 and 2024). After sweeping cuts to CSW contracts at the U.S Department of Education and Federal Communication Commission in February 2025, CSW was a \$3 million dollar company. After the D.C. budget was reset to 2024 levels and subsequent cuts to state and local DOES and DHS programs, CSW became a \$1 million dollar company. The CSW social services contracts that have been terminated or paused impact a pipeline of 400 temporary assistance for needy family (TANF),110 supplemental nutrition assistance program (SNAP) participants, 70-100 dislocated workers, seniors, and youth, 20-30 returning citizens, and 10-15 No Benefit Scholarship (NO BS) recipients. This is the first time in the 14-year history of CSW we must fight to stay open to continue serving D.C. residents with education, experience, employment and entrepreneurship opportunities. Dr. Robert Jordan and his entire staff are fighting through September 30, 2025 to broker a solution through government, philanthropic, or foundation resources until budgets are restored.
